

2022 YOM HASHOAH (HOLOCAUST) ART CONTEST

All Oklahoma area Middle and High School students (grades 6-12) are eligible to enter the contest

Submission Deadline Tuesday, April 19

The 2021 Yom HaShoah Art Contest will focus on Jewish victims whose lives were destroyed with little intervention from those who could have helped.

Our theme will be: "...And the World Was Silent."

Artwork may reflect student artist's(s') response(s) to the theme or their artistic response to any aspect of the Holocaust.

2022 Holocaust Interfaith Commemoration will be held at either B'nai Emunah

or via ZOOM on Thurs. April 28 at 7:00 pm

Artwork will be displayed at the Jewish Federation of Tulsa's Sylvan Auditorium (2021 East 71st St., Tulsa)

CRITERIA FOR YOM HASHOAH (HOLOCAUST) ART CONTEST:

- "Artwork" is understood to be visual art in any medium, but is not understood to refer to film, music, dance, or drama (the performing arts) for our purposes.

- All artworks should be easily portable and either freestanding or able to sit on an easel or tabletop.

- Artworks may be submitted by individual students or by groups of students.

- The artist's name, school and teacher should appear on the artwork in a place that is not visible when displayed (such as the bottom or back of the artwork). Download entry form at

- A title and short (1-3 sentence) artist/s' statement should accompany each artwork. Use template attached.

- Artworks that require batteries or electricity may not be displayed, for logistical reasons.

- Artworks that include the depiction of blood, body parts, or ashes will not be displayed.

- Artwork will be judged based on originality, attention to detail, and evidence of historical research. Judges will include representatives from the Council for Holocaust Education, the Sherwin Miller Museum, our guest speaker, and former teachers.

Prizes for Yom HaShoah (Holocaust) Art Contest:

Finalists will be selected and the following prizes awarded in the **Middle School** and **High School** categories.

First Place: \$250

Second place: \$150

Third place: \$50

- **Mon./Tues., April 25 and/or 26:** Artwork delivered 3-5 pm to B'nai Emunah (1719 S. Owasso Ave, Tulsa) if event is in-person OR to Jewish Federation (2021 E. 71st St., Tulsa) if even is via ZOOM

- **Wed. April 27 2:00 pm:** Judging of Artworks

- **Thur., April 28:** Winners announced at 2022 Holocaust Commemoration at B'nai Emunah OR Via ZOOM

- **Mon. May 2 -Fri. May 13:** Contest winning artworks plus Honorable Mentions displayed at the Jewish Federation of Tulsa
