President's Report — Ed Sherman

My two-year term as your president has been a period of many changes for the Federation and for many of us personally. It started in the throes of the pandemic, which created many restrictions and new requirements. My term ends with many of those restrictions gone. Our day camp is now able to operate without any pandemic restrictions as to how many participants we can enroll. We no longer must reduce our levels of participation in our regular activities and engagement has returned to pre-pandemic levels.

During this time our staff did a fantastic job of improving our facilities. Some of them are obvious such as the general lighting being converted to LED fixtures which lowers our electricity usage while increasing lighting levels. For many years we experienced water leaks because of the building's storm gutter system, which has now been corrected. The Facilities Committee and its chair Michael Mudd deserve credit for these improvements.

We have also enhanced our security. Some aspects of those upgrades have already been completed, while others are in process. Thanks to Lori Frank and the Safe and Secure Committee for their diligent work.

Tracey Herst-Woods and her staff have worked long hours to assure that the Sherwin Miller Museum of Jewish Art will be reaccredited by the American Association of Museums.

The Charles Schusterman Jewish Community Center has also had its share of success. I especially want to congratulate Martha Kelly for her summertime "Swim for All Program" for children from low income families. The program was so successful that it will be expanded this summer.

Thank you to Isabella Silberg for bringing new life to our monthly luncheons. The new program "The Lunch Bunch" has been interesting and has attracted more participants.

Early in the year our community was challenged by the Jewish Federations of North America to raise \$84,000 in support of the people of Ukraine. We exceeded that goal. Congratulations to the entire community and all who donated.

Our Executive Director, Aida Nozick, has been here for 23 months and has made many positive changes, including identifying funds that made it possible to do many of the major property repairs and refining our annual campaign strategy. Thanks to her and her staff.

On a personal note I want to thank the entire membership for allowing me to have this opportunity to serve. It has been at various times frustrating, challenging, exhilarating and fulfilling, sometimes all at the same time. Special thanks to the JFT Board of Directors and Executive Committee who frequently did the heavy lifting.

I wish the best to my successor, Jared Goldfarb. Jared will need your help! Please be receptive to his requests; better yet, volunteer when you see the need and the opportunity.

Executive Director's Report — Aida Nozick

2022 was a year of renewed dedication and commitment to our local and global Jewish community.

Locally, we strived to nurture collaboration in the community working together under a shared vision, United Jewish Tulsa. This nurturing is our ongoing commitment towards a stronger, more inclusive Jewish Tulsa.

Last year our Charles Schusterman Jewish Community Center underwent many facility improvements that had been deferred for some time including upgrading to LED lighting, much needed roof repairs, and upgrades to the Sharna and Irvin Frank Aquatics Center. Our campus is large and with it comes necessary maintenance to ensure its longevity. I am grateful to the facilities committee and Michael Mudd for leading the charge on many of these projects.

Our Holocaust Education Legislation committee, led by Charlotte Schuman, proved unstoppable in their efforts to ensure the passage of Senate Bill 1671, ensuring Holocaust Education for grades 6-12 in all Oklahoma Public Schools. Moving forward, to better serve our mission, we created a hybrid full-time staff position, Director of Holocaust Education and Community Relations, to maximize our outreach with the greater Jewish and non-Jewish community. By merging these jobs, we strive to have greater impact and outreach on both educating the wider community about the Holocaust in addition to building bridges with the interfaith community based on commonalities and understanding.

Engagement with young families and young professionals continues to grow. We will continue to seek innovative and educational programming opportunities to strengthen our Jewish identity, and build a stronger, prouder community.

I am proud of my amazing staff for continuously planning engaging programs with valuable content. The Israel Engagement committee and Shlichah, Chen Shoval, work hard to bring Israeli culture and history to our community. Chen is completing her time here in Tulsa as our Shlichah, she will continue to be our friend and resource on all things Israel. I thank Chen for her meaningful work and commitment and each one of the staff members for their continued hard work, ensuring we continue to improve the quality of programming and engagement for Jewish life in Tulsa.

I also wish to acknowledge my board of directors for their continued dedication and never-ending support. Their guidance has been monumental as I continue to learn the history and drive our mission forward.

This year, the Jewish Federation of Tulsa turns 85. That is quite an accomplishment given the small number of Jewish families living in our surrounding area. The foundation built here is strong and will continue to thrive by working together as United Jewish Tulsa.

2022 Annual Campaign

Uniting our local and global Jewish community.

The United Jewish Tulsa theme was felt more than ever at the 43rd Annual MLK Parade and the annual Tulsa Pride Parade. Gathering as One Jewish Tulsa, members of Congregation B'nai Emunah, Temple Israel, and the Jewish Federation marched in support of diversity, inclusion, and tolerance. Standing up for our beliefs as a community makes us stronger!



We started out the year with a successful interfaith program, **Comedy for Peace**. Held both virtually and in-person, the event drew 180 Jews, Christians, and Muslim (60% from other faiths other than Judaism) to come together and laugh allowing for open conversations.

After a two-year Covid break, the **Oklahoma Jewish Film Festival** returned in partnership with the Circle Cinema. The Oklahoma Jewish Film Festival builds community awareness, appreciation and pride in the diversity of the Jewish people through film. Exploring common themes of Jewish identity and culture, the OKJFF uses the power of compelling stories to bring people of all religions and cultures together. New this year, a successful Young Jewish Professional and Sisterhood pre-film event was added, building community and excitement to the festival.

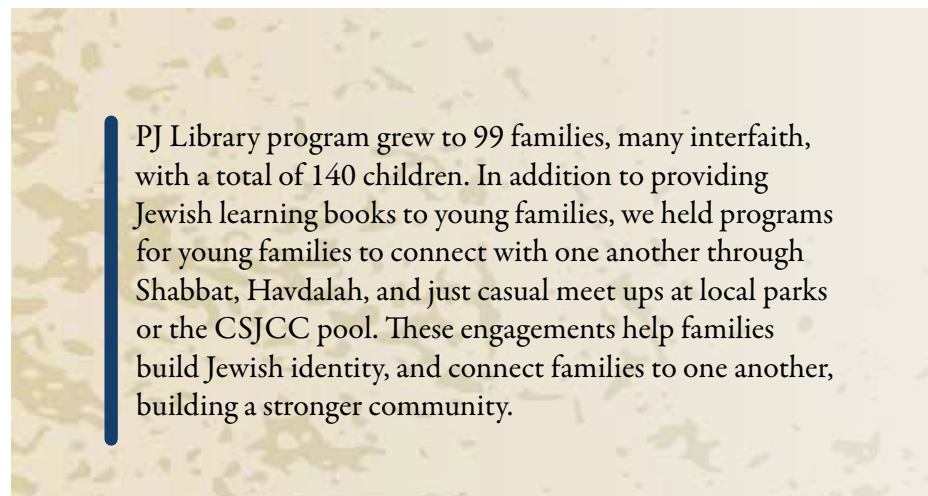




Our Holocaust Education Legislation committee worked hard ensuring the passage of Senate Bill 1671, directing the State Department of Education to develop and provide age-appropriate Holocaust Education in Oklahoma Public Schools, grades 6-12.



We revamped our mid-day adult programming by combining two separate programs and adding an educational component. Successful from the start, the **Lunch Bunch**, geared for all ages and genders, regularly brings in an average of 40 participants to meet socially and “learn a bunch in just one lunch.”



PJ Library program grew to 99 families, many interfaith, with a total of 140 children. In addition to providing Jewish learning books to young families, we held programs for young families to connect with one another through Shabbat, Havdalah, and just casual meet ups at local parks or the CSJCC pool. These engagements help families build Jewish identity, and connect families to one another, building a stronger community.



The annual **Kristallnacht Remembrance** was a successful collaboration with Tulsa Community College. Approximately 300 members of the interfaith Tulsa community came to VanTrease Performing Art center to listen to first- and second-generation Holocaust survivors tell their personal stories. The program included student winners from the annual Kristallnacht art contest receiving on-stage recognition.



Annual Campaign kicked off with an entertaining evening featuring mentalist Sidney Friedman. After several years of not being together in person, the evening was filled with the warmth and joy of community for the crowd of 116.

Young Jewish Professional engagement continues to grow steadily. Six programs were aimed at building community and increasing participation in this growing demographic. A community drive for hygiene kits resulted in 200 packets, donated to the Tulsa Day Center, for this worthwhile mitzvah, helping Tulsans' experiencing homelessness. On Yom HaShoah, 19 young Jewish Professionals marked the day by touring the Sherwin Miller Museum of Art Sanditen/Kaiser Holocaust Center.

Sisterhood Social Action Project was a collaboration with Congregation B'nai Emunha, Temple Israel, and the Jewish Federation. 40 women donated their time to wrap hundreds of presents and prepare hygiene kits for needy families through DVIS, Domestic Violence Intervention Services.



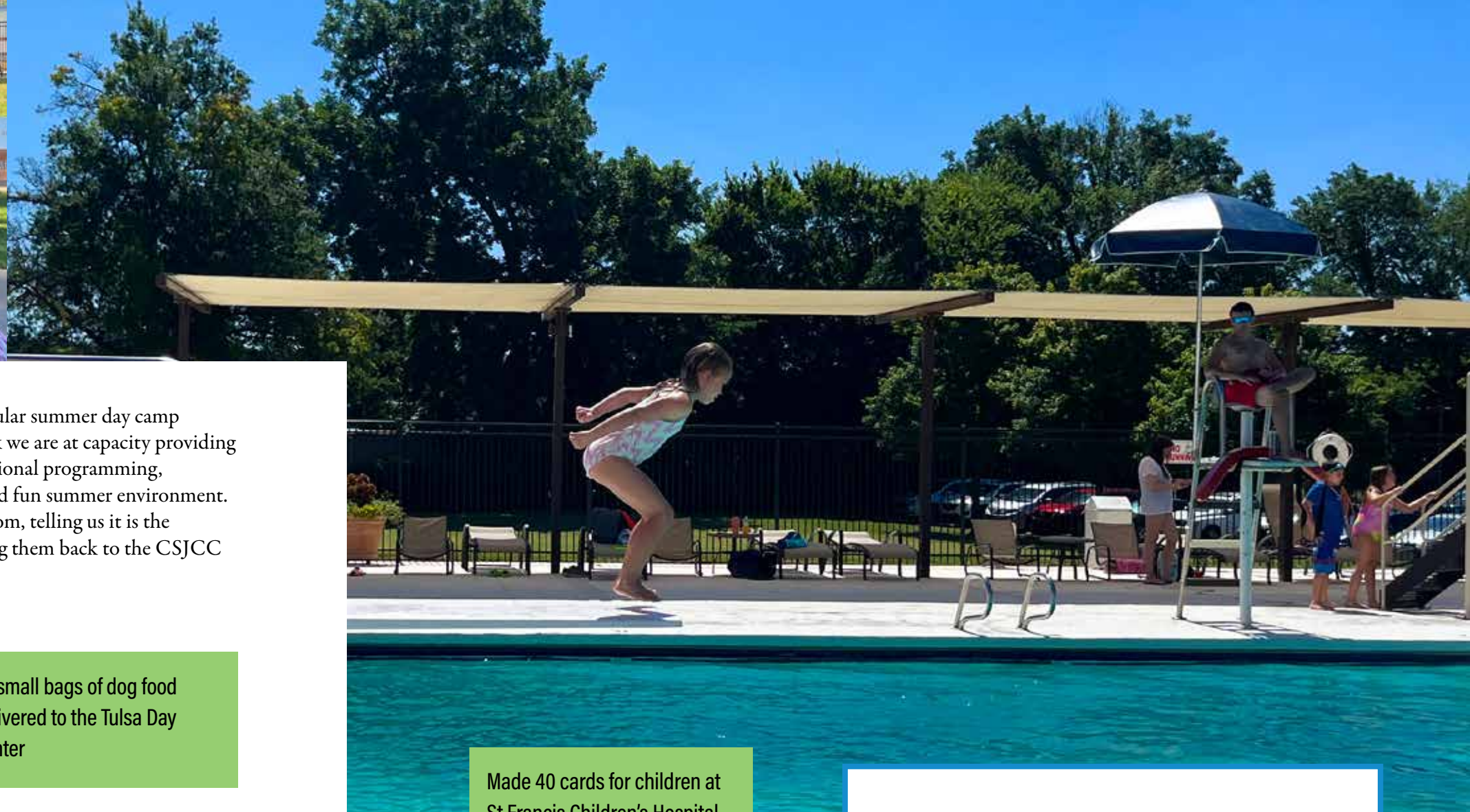

Anyone can join. Everyone belongs.

A new pilot program **Swim for All**, was created with assistance from the George Kaiser Family Foundation. The program provides swim lessons, an important life skill, to low income children in our surrounding neighborhood. Working together with Title I neighborhood schools, the program quickly sold out. Due to the successful debut of **Swim for All**, plans are underway to triple the size of enrollment for summer 2023.

The end of the year brought together over 100 community members for **Family Day of Service**, held at Legacy Plaza, the home to seven nonprofit organizations. In partnership with Congregation B'nai Emunah, Temple Israel, Mizel Jewish Community Day School, and the Jewish Federation of Tulsa children ages 10 and up and parents/guardians worked together preparing hundreds of food packs for Against Global Hunger. Younger children engaged in learning activities about the importance of giving back.





Camp Shalom continues to be a wildly popular summer day camp experience for children ages 3-15. Each week we are at capacity providing swimming, arts, athletics, games, and educational programming, including weekly Shabbat, ensuring a safe and fun summer environment. Year after year campers return to Camp Shalom, telling us it is the friendships they build that continues to bring them back to the CSJCC campus each summer.

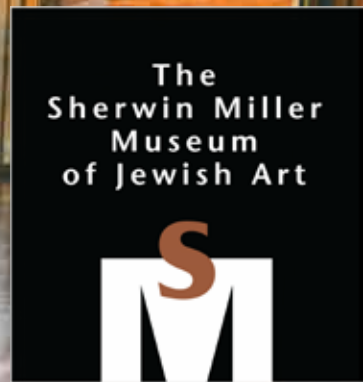
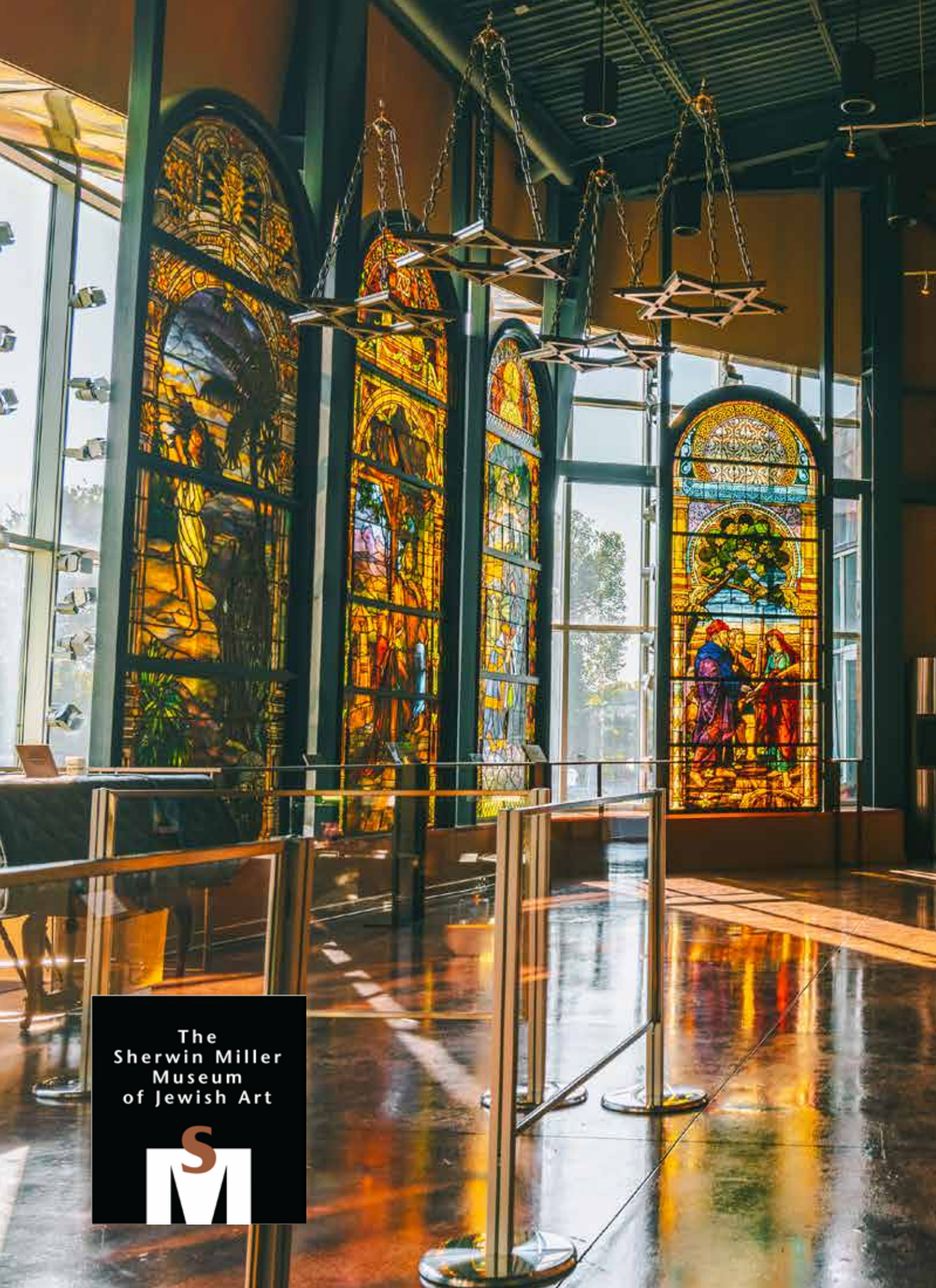

Through the lens of both fine art and artifacts, the collection provides a testament and tribute to the resiliency of the Jewish people and those who seek to learn more about them.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS

1,419 students, aged 13-14, toured the museum as part of the Any Given Child program.

Total attendance increased 33% over 2021.

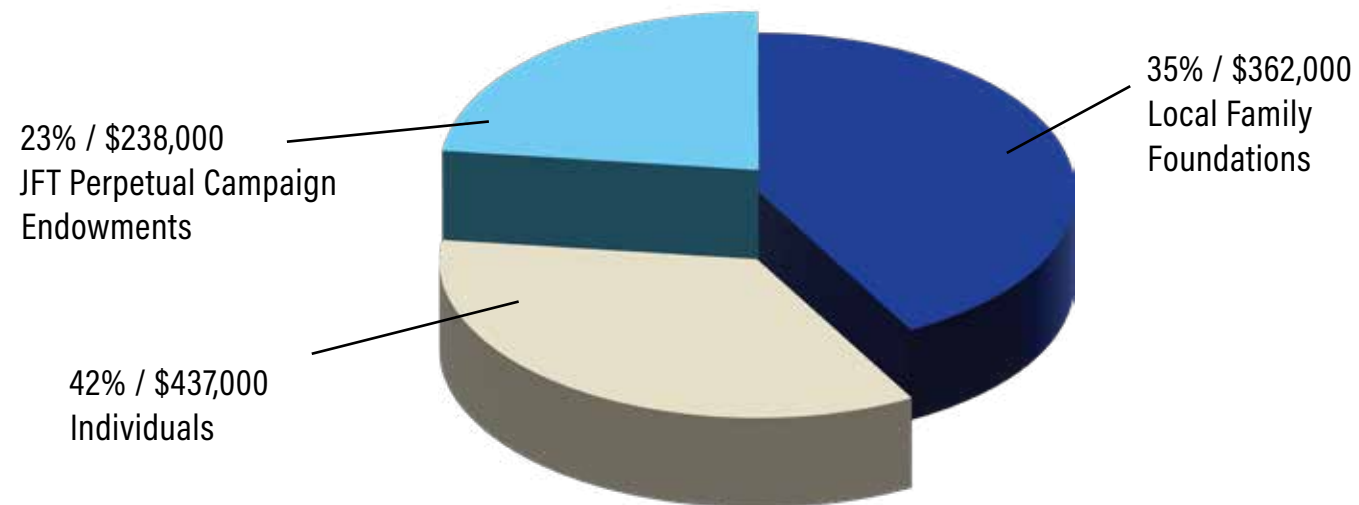

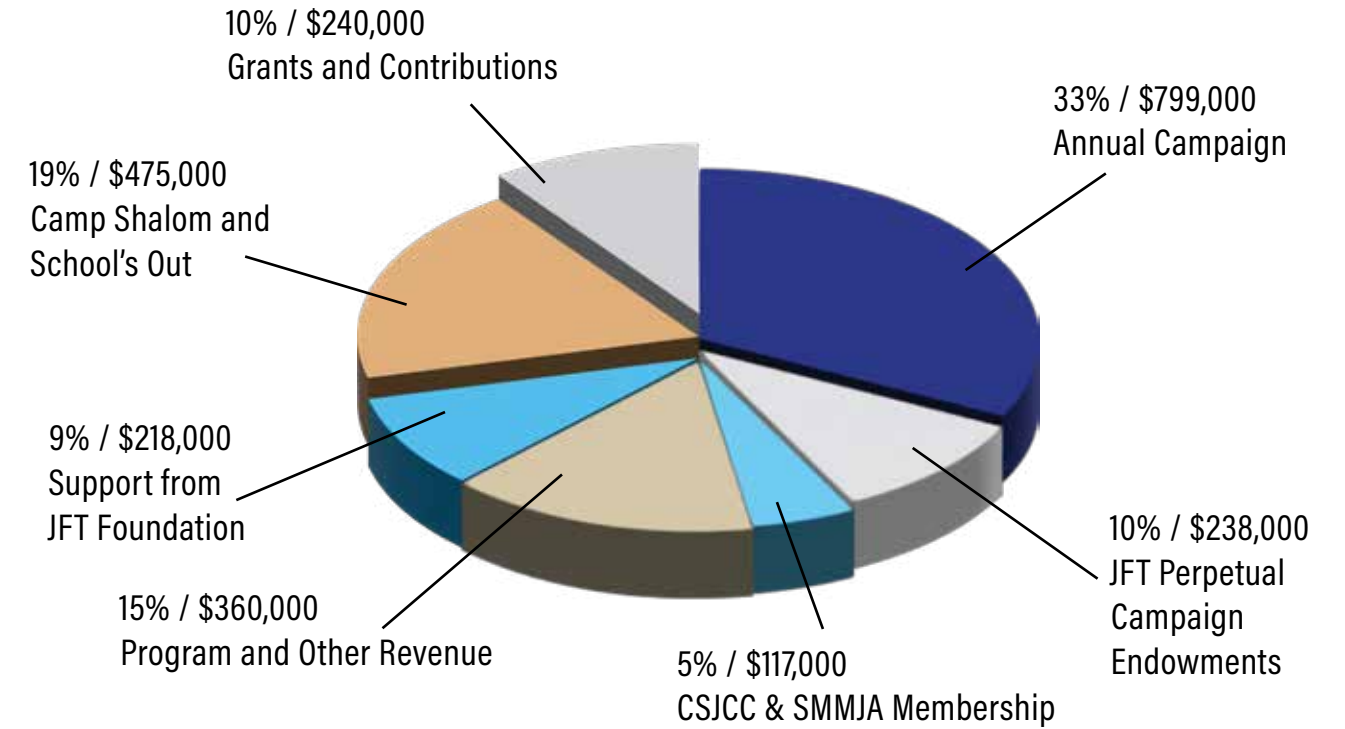

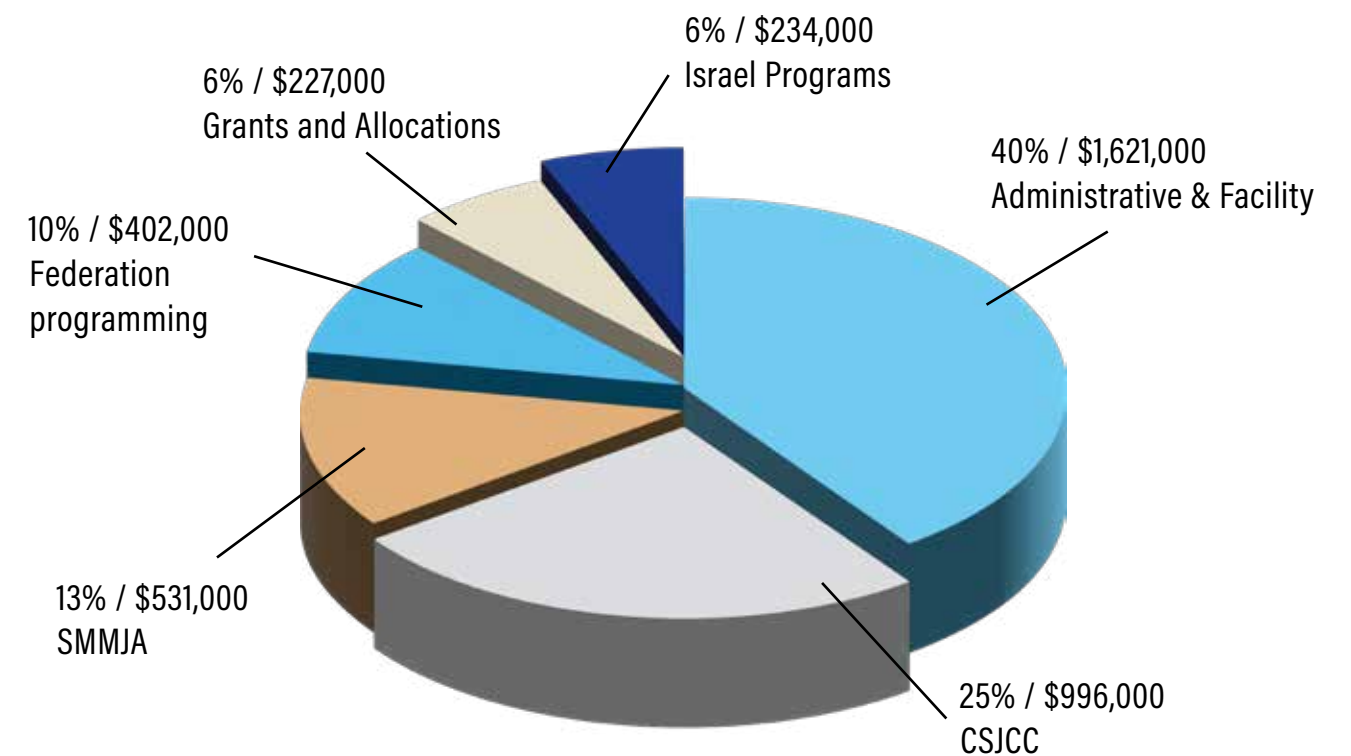
Campaign Donations by Source 2022
