President's Report — Jared Goldfarb

I am honored to reflect on the accomplishments and milestones achieved during the first twelve months of my tenure as president. It has been a year marked by change, growth, and resilience. I am proud of what we have accomplished together thus far.

One of the significant transitions we faced during this period was the change in our Executive Director. Despite this challenge, we swiftly implemented an interim leadership solution, by contracting Wendy Thomas, who is helping to ensure the continued stability and effectiveness of our organization's operations.

My first year also came with great sadness for what began on Oct 7th in Israel. At the time, we were without an Executive Director and our professional staff quickly took charge and planned “Solidarity in Song” a community-wide unity event, bringing nearly 300 diverse Tulsans together, including interfaith and Jewish leaders, Tulsa Mayor G.T. Bynum, Jews and non-Jews alike, to show support for our brothers and sisters in Israel and around the world.

In July, our Sherwin Miller Museum of Jewish Art under, Deputy Director of SMMJA - Chief Museum Officer, Tracey Herst-Woods leadership, was granted reaccreditation from American Alliance of Museums. The process undertaken by museum staff and board is quite tedious and comprehensive and we are very proud of their accomplishment. Our Museum's annual gala in late October was also a success, drawing attention to the rich cultural heritage and contributions of the Jewish community in Tulsa. Our Museum's commitment to education and cultural preservation was further demonstrated through the introduction of new exhibits at the museum, showcasing the diversity and richness of Jewish history and heritage.

I am delighted to report that our 2023 Annual Campaign saw remarkable success meeting our fundraising goal, a testament to the dedication and generosity of our community. Your support enables us to fulfill our mission and make a meaningful impact on the lives of those we serve. Our Director of Development and Programming, Isabella Silberg alongside Brian Edward Brouse, campaign committee chair, and the rest of campaign committee worked tirelessly throughout the year striving to meet our campaign goal.

2023 saw excellent growth at the Charles Schusterman Jewish Community Center, under Deputy Director of CSJCC, Martha Kelley's leadership memberships rose by 28%. Laura Allen, Director of Community Outreach and Membership introduced a new Wellness Series adding a new dimension to our health and wellness programs focusing on the entire individual—including physical, social, emotional, and intellectual wellness.

I am pleased to announce the appointment of a new Deputy Director of Finance, Robert Saucedo, whose expertise and leadership will undoubtedly strengthen our financial stewardship and sustainability.

As we continue our search for a new Executive Director, I am confident that we will find a visionary leader who shares our passion and commitment to serving the Jewish community of Tulsa.

Lastly, I am thrilled to welcome our new board members, whose diverse perspectives and experiences will enrich our collective efforts and propel us forward into a future filled with promise and opportunity.

In closing, I extend my deepest gratitude to each and every one of you for your unwavering support and dedication to the Jewish Federation of Tulsa. Together, we have achieved significant milestones, and I am excited about the journey ahead as we continue to strengthen our community and fulfill our shared vision of a strong Jewish future for all.

Interim Executive Director's Report — Wendy Thomas

As I look back on the last half year, I must confess that being Interim Executive Director of the Jewish Federation of Tulsa was not on my Bingo card for 2023/2024. However, it has been my honor and privilege to serve Jewish Tulsa in this role at your time of need ... a time of need on the local level, helping to steward the staff and lay leadership through your executive transition and a time of need on a global level as the Jewish people seek to navigate heartbreak, rising antisemitism, and complex politics after October 7th.

In my short months here, I have noted what an impact this organization has on our community. Both Jewish Tulsa and beyond.

The impact starts at birth with child-focused programs such as PJ Library currently serving 111 families, more than 500 Camp Shalom campers a year, 100% growth in the Swim For All program, and through the Federation's in-kind support of Mizel Jewish Community Day School housed in our facility.

Our support of young people in the community continues through aiding of the Midrasha youth program, the BBYO community, and new this year, a Student-to-Student advocacy program for high school students. We teach thousands of Oklahoma residents, especially school children, about the Holocaust and host four contests a year for school children to learn about Jewish history and religious observances.

We are also a place for lifelong learning and connection. We make sure young professionals can find community with each other; bring together J-Moms, who are raising Jewish children, to share comradery and support. We have affinity groups and programs for Gen-Xers, philanthropic women, and doctors. Finally, active seniors—and others—pursue health, wellness, community, and lifelong learning as members of the Charles Schusterman Jewish Community Center.

We connect Tulsa with Israel and with the Jewish community worldwide. Our hosting of an Israeli emissary has been continuous for more than 50 years. We are a steadfast supporter of citizen diplomacy and the sister city program. Now, during this crucial time for supporting the people of Israel, we have raised awareness for the plight of the hostages that remain in Gaza and have sent funds both directly to Israeli nonprofit organizations and the fundraising relief effort of Jewish Federations of North America, Swords of Iron campaign.

So, if you haven't visited in a while, I urge you to do so. Come see the permanent and changing exhibits at The Sherwin Miller Museum of Jewish Art. Check out our facilities and fitness classes in the Lori M. Frank Fitness Center. Spend your summer with us by the pool at the Sharna & Irvin Frank Aquatics Center. Interact with neighbors from five to eighty-five in this place which belongs to you.

Personally, I want to thank you for your warm welcome and support. I'm proud to be shining this spotlight on all we have and can accomplish together.

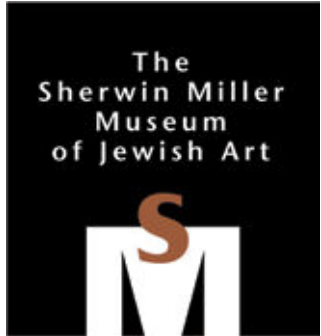

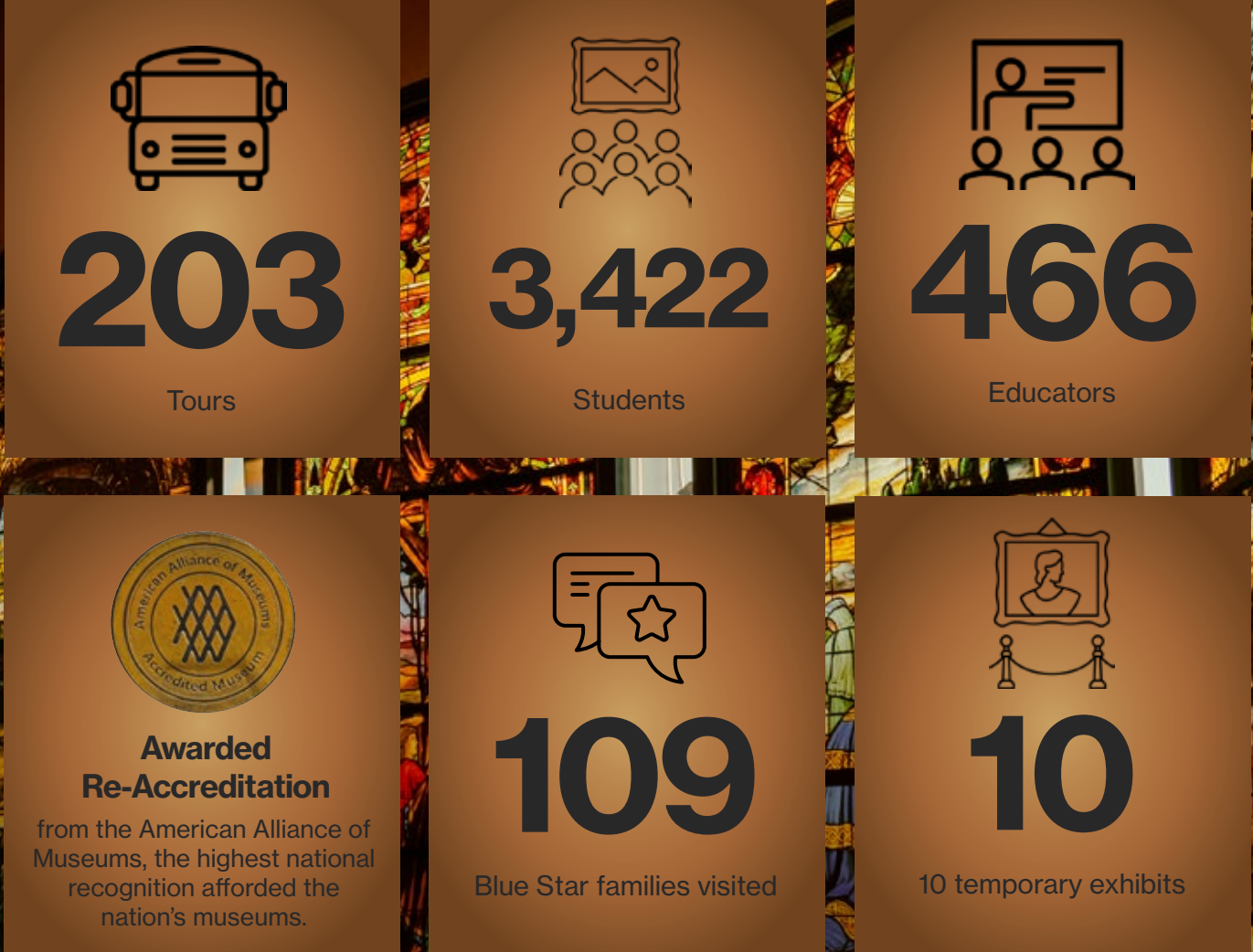

Alice Blue

Alice Blue has served as the chair of the Council for Holocaust Education for many years, working closely with Eva Unterman, educators, and community volunteers to provide education about the Holocaust to the Tulsa community through commemorative events. Her commitment to building and maintaining relationships with interfaith community groups is legendary and her devotion to Holocaust Education is very personal. A child of Polish Jewish parents, Rose and Daniel Blue (of blessed memory), met in Bergen-Belsen and immigrated to the United States as survivors to build a new life after the war.

In addition to Alice's nearly 25 years involvement with the Council for Holocaust Education, she has been involved in many other positions working towards a better Jewish future in Tulsa. In the late 90s, Alice joined the Community Relations Committee (CRC), eventually becoming chair. Alice also worked at the Charles Schusterman Jewish Community Center as the program director overseeing teen (BBYO) and adult programming. Later, Alice worked for 5 years as a volunteer advisor for BBYO.

Alice has a master's degree in social work from Yeshiva University and has had a storied career working in the nonprofit sector at important organizations such as the Community Service Council. Today she serves as Clinical Services Director at Take Control Initiative. We recognize her not only for her service to our organization but for her lifetime commitment to a more just and equitable world.



Austin Polun

Since Austin first arrived in Tulsa in April 2023, he was ready to jump into the action of Jewish Tulsa. Austin's first program he attended was a Young Jewish Professionals program celebrating Lag B'omer. Today, Austin is at every single program and event, volunteering to come early or stay after and help with clean up. A memory that stands out when thinking about Austin's dedication to our organization is at Trivia Night in 2023. Austin couldn't attend due to his working hours, but he came mid-trivia to say hello to friends and stayed after to help clean up. At the Israel Solidarity gathering in October, Austin stayed until the bitter end, ensuring that all the chairs and equipment were returned to their proper location. 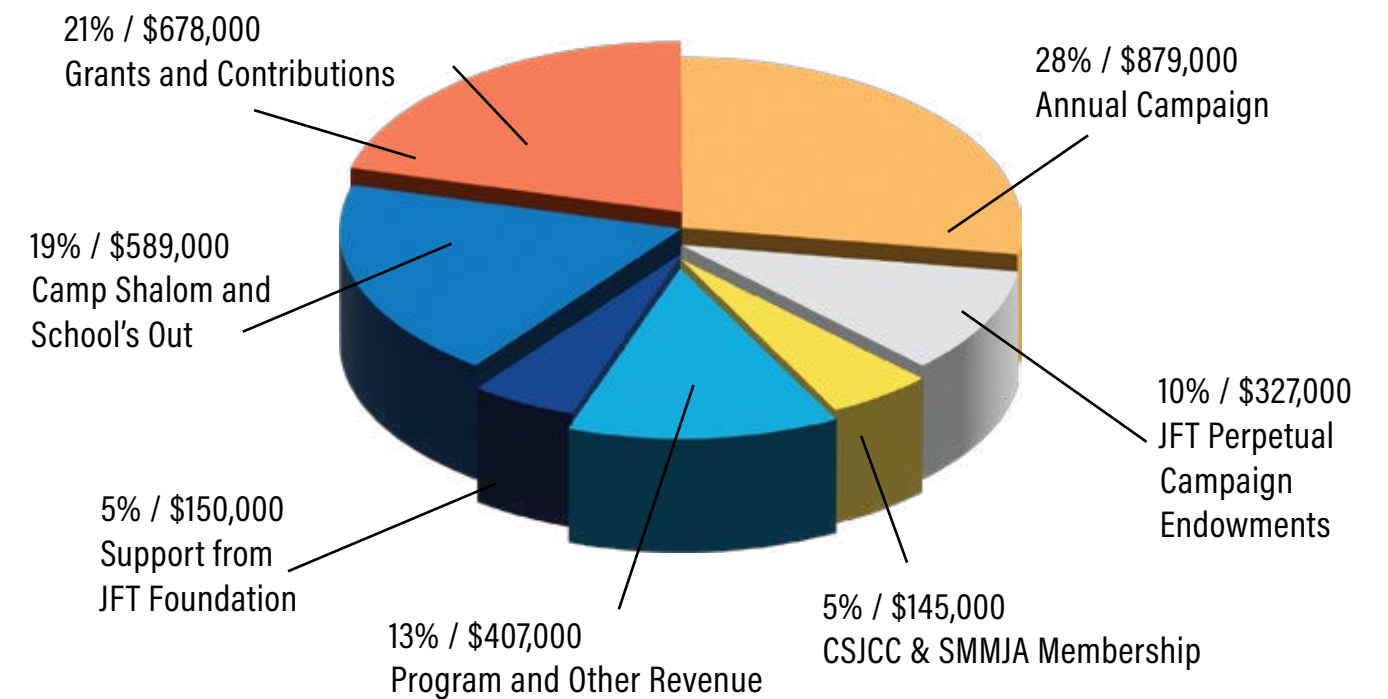

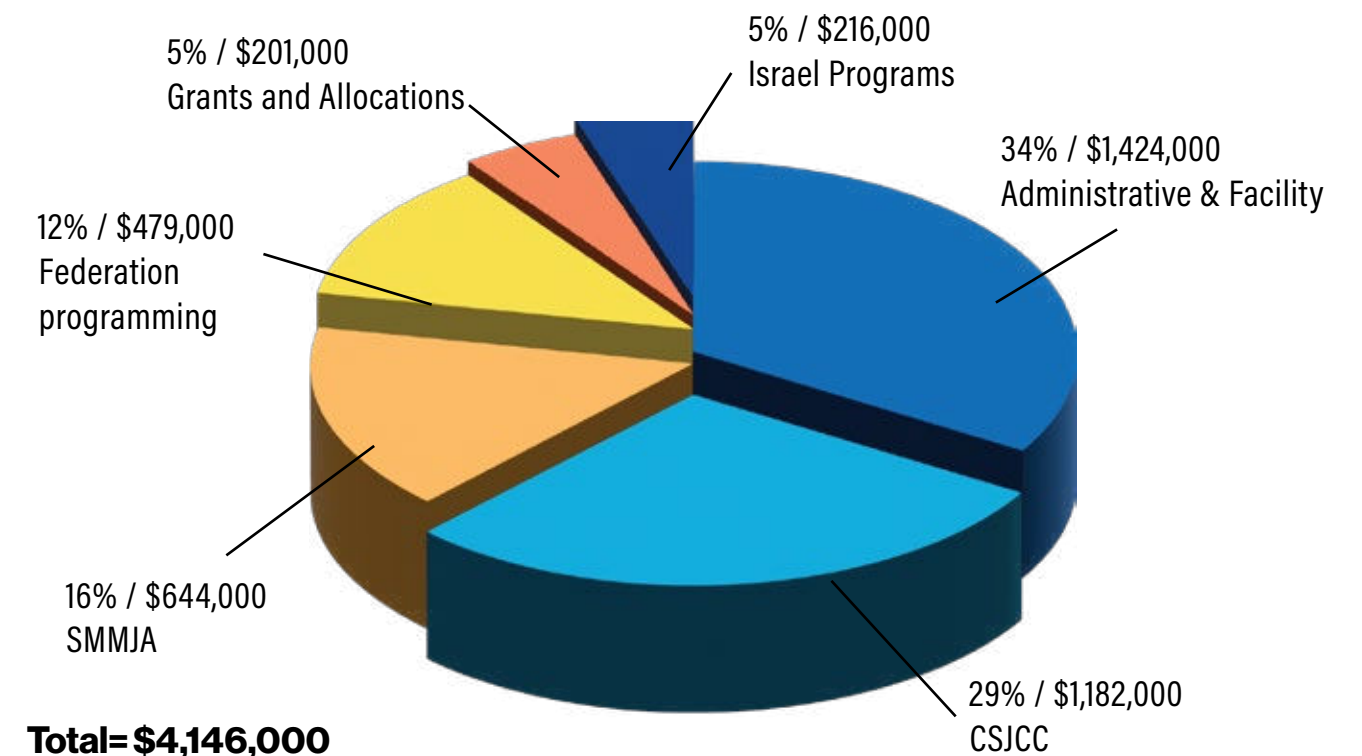

OPERATING REVENUE BREAKDOWN 2023



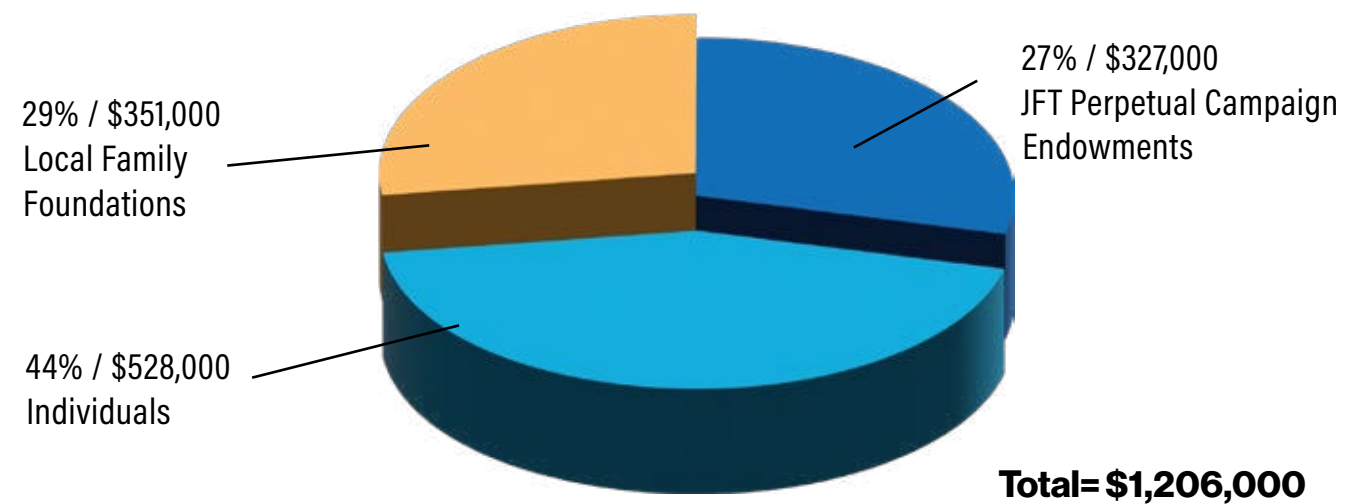
